

Every 37 seconds, a child disappears in this country. Adults disappear nearly as often, but there are no accurate statistics kept.

A completed kit helps law enforcement begin the search immediately. Every second counts when someone is missing. The kit is also used if identification of a body becomes necessary.

No one is exempt from becoming a missing person based on age, gender, race, or social/economic status. Because you love, and are loved, it is imperative that you and all family members have a completed ID kit regardless of age.

## Instructions for using this ID kit:

- Include a current photo.
- Update the photo and physical description every 6 to 12 months. You may download new kits free from our website.
- A DNA sample should be kept with this kit. Place hair samples including some roots in an acid-free paper envelope or zip lock bag and attach in DNA sample area.
- Print legibly and enter all information as accurately as possible.
- Maintain this information in safe and accessible location.

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### What To Do If Your Loved One Is Missing:

- Contact local law enforcement (call 911). Write down the name of the officer, telephone number, and case number. Give this ID kit to the officer. Make sure information is entered into NCIC (National Crime Information Computer).
- If age 17 and under contact the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) at (800) 845-5678. If you suspect that the child could be a runaway, then call the National Runaway Switchboard at 1-800-621-4000. If age 18 and older, contact Nations Center for Missing Adults at 1-800-690-3463.
- Start a phone log of all calls received and placed.
